## Poultry Update

The **H5N1 Avian Flu** is really rearing its ugly head and getting too close to home. As you know, we are not accepting birds for any auction at this time. We do not know when we will be accepting birds. We realize this may not be popular but our number one concern is always the health and well being of our staff, community, and animals. There is no reason to take a chance on infecting our local flocks. ODA Director, Brian Baldrige has outlined the procedure for how the state is tackling infections. Samples from flocks thought to carry the flu are sent to the Animal Disease Diagnostic Lab in Reynoldsburg for testing. If received before 10:00 a.m., results are available within 7 hours. Officials are working hard to stop the spread. It should be noted that there has been a human case of avian flu in Ohio. Cases of the flu in humans have been primarily among people who have had close contact with infected birds; and the Center for Disease Control and Prevention maintains the risk to humans to be low. The best thing to do if you find dead birds is to not touch them. With this ongoing threat, it's crucial for everyone to remain vigilant. If you spot any sick or dead wild birds, especially bald eagles, waterfowl, such as geese, ducks or notice large groups of birds showing unusual signs of illness, please report immediately by calling 800-WILDLIFE(800-945-3543). Your observations help wildlife officials track and manage the spread of disease, protecting both wildlife and local poultry farms.

Poultry owners play a crucial role in protecting their flocks by **enforcing strict biosecurity** measures.

Here are some tips on how to protect your flock:

**Keep your birds indoors.** During high risk times, keeping your poultry indoors avoids contact with wild birds and their droppings.

**Penning & Containment:** If your birds must be outside, ensure they are securely penned and away from any water sources frequented by wild waterfowl.

Keep food in closed containers preventing access by rodents and wild birds.

By following these simple yet effective steps, you can reduce the chances of an outbreak.

## SUNDAY DROP OFF INFORMATION:

With a Monday Sale Day, some consignors need to drop off their items on Sunday. Livestock can be dropped off and completing the blue & orange cards located on the dock. Please fill out both sides of each card and place one in the yellow can & one in the mousetrap at the pen you use.

Hay and straw need to be labeled with consignor's name, address, and phone number. We advise placing your paper in a baggy and making sure it is secure from the wind.

There is no early drop-off for small animals or Endless Treasures. All items left are at the consignor's risk.
